If a child develops symptoms of COVID-19 while at the setting the parent or carer will be contacted immediately and the child collected and taken home. The child will be isolated and cared for in a well ventilated room.

Staff should remain with a consistent group as much as is practicably possible Care routines including provision of meals, nappy changing and toileting should be within the space/time allocated to each 'bubble' wherever possible The use of communal internal spaces will be restricted as much as possible. This is a common and expected reaction, and isolation is not required unless coronavirus (COVID-19) is suspected. Further information is available in what to expect after vaccinations and vaccination tips for parents. Whilst teething can cause some known side effects such as flushed cheeks and sore gums, NHS guidelines state that fever is not a symptom of teething. Parents and carers should monitor side effects from a vaccination or teething, and if they are concerned about their child's health, they should seek advice from their GP or NHS 111. If you have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive, and you are fully vaccinated (two weeks past their second dose) and under 18: NO SYMPTOMS? No need to self-isolate but get a PCR test on day 2 and day 8 GOT SYMPTOMS? Self-isolate immediately and get a PCR test. Isolate for 10 days if positive. Due to the vulnerability of some staff and children in the setting and in order to minimise the risk of exposure we request that siblings stay away from the setting as a precautionary measure until the results of the test have been confirmed as negative. "There may be circumstances where a child who would normally be exempt is directed to self-isolate by TTP. These circumstances will be identified by TTP on a case by case basis." If you have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive, and you are not fully vaccinated and over 18: NO SYMPTOMS? Self-isolate immediately for 10 days and get a PCR test on day 2 and day 8 GOT SYMPTOMS? Self-isolate and get a PCR test. If positive self-isolate for 10 days. If negative, self- isolate for 10 days and take a test on day 8. Evidence of PCR tests must be seen by the nursery
